Livvy Elder– college are planning to spend a lot on new accommodation, probably asking for a low increase, factor in their upcoming spending

Gareth Langley– student loan frozen, squash court is a mess, cleaning for it, sports ground facilities

Rachel Dellar – actual proper blues grant, sports training for vac res

Chris Davies – 1% change is £7000 for college

Jacob Diggle– internship fund, negotiation strategy, lots of alumni provide rooms and placements

Jacob Diggle – wider JCR refit

Gareth Langley– new students are paying £9000 this year

Mike Hardy – access problems with costs

Chris Davies – telephon raised about £200,000, they have many income streams,

Jack Evans – there is a memorandum of understanding that they cant put up rent in a way that discourages students applying

Rachel Dellar – good to push for lots on concessions and has been a problem

Jacob Diggle – vac res is random cost, not banded. Making accommodation better, not worse and cheaper.
