1. Volunteers needed for study

Study Description:

Researchers at the Nuffield Department of Clinical Neurosciences, University of Oxford are seeking volunteers aged 18 – 45 for a Transcranial Direct Current Stimulation (tDCS) study.

The purpose of this study is to examine how non-invasive brain stimulation can affect skills such as decision making and learning. The results of this study will

inform future research on decision making processes in depression and anxiety disorders.

This study involves up to three visits to the Nuffield Department of Clinical Neurosciences or the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Oxford. Participants will be asked to fill out mood and anxiety questionnaires and perform a computer-based learning task while receiving tDCS. Each session will take no more than 1.5 hours, and participants will be reimbursed for their time and travel expenses.
