### 1. PMB ART

'Meaningful Vision' at the Pembroke JCR Art Gallery commemorates the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Anthony Emery's founding of the Pembroke JCR Art Fund. The exhibition displays the breadth of acquisitions made since Emery's time at Pembroke and re-engages with his desire to enable young people to engage with the art of their time.

The show features four pieces from the Artist Collective 'Cypher' (Ellen Hughes, Holly Graham, Amba Sayal-Bennett and Laszlo von Dohnanyi). The group was established in 2015 and are based in London and Berlin. They are an artist-led initiative and recently hosted an exhibition titled Backdrop as part of the Art Licks Weekend in London.

'Meaningful Vision' is accompanied by a significant 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Special Edition Catalogue, which unites the voices of those with personal ties to the Collection, from across generations and pieces together the narrative of its assemblage. It also includes extended entries on major works in the collection and artist interviews. The publication is available to purchase at the gallery at a cost of £8 - or £4 with student card!

## Psychology Studies

1. Researchers at the Nuffield Department of Clinical Neurosciences, University of Oxford are seeking volunteers aged 18 – 45 for a Transcranial Direct Current Stimulation (tDCS) study.

The purpose of this study is to examine how non-invasive brain stimulation can affect skills such as decision making and learning. The results of this study will inform future research on decision making processes in depression and anxiety disorders.

This study involves two visits to the John Radcliffe in Oxford. Participants will be asked to fill out mood and anxiety questionnaires and perform a computer-based learning task during and/or after receiving tDCS. Each session will take no more than 2 hours, and participants will be reimbursed for their time and travel expenses.
