The nature of nuclear energy and what it offers to mankind and the environment have been misrepresented ever since the 1940s. Based

on simple scientific and medical evidence the lecture will explain what we now know. The need to establish a new scientific relationship with nature on the basis of this offer is pressing and action should follow.

At the end John Lindberg, speaking from a political perspective, will discuss what we should now do.
