MAIN IDEAS

• Set up an independent email address:

Welfare officers should be available for contact at a **generic email address** (e.g.

female.welfare@ccc.ox.ac.uk) both to protect their own welfare and to make online communication less personal for those who might find that more appropriate (also as a confirmed means of vacation support)

- Improve college-student welfare relationship:
 - Explore separation of academic and pastoral role of tutors
 - Look at improving/rustication college policy from a welfare perspective
 - Continue conversation about the possibility of an independent college counsellor
- Endorse the possibility of a third, gender-non-specific, welfare officer

Currently, it would not be possible for a someone gendernon-binary to run as a candidate for a welfare position – this something that should definitely be challenged.

(It would also increase the amount of welfare support available for the college while spreading the responsibility

 Bring back Corpus Yoga Society

Make resources more available:

All welfare contact details should be made available **remotely**. The JCR is a very public place and having something as simple as an email sent at the beginning of term would make important contact details available far more easily.

Update and <u>promote</u> the **welfare document** on the JCR website - ensure it provides details on all welfare options, appropriate to each welfare concern.
