1. Report from the President

Gemma: We had an experience where we were treated as an administrative nightmare - we were called 'chaos', 'a confusion', with no understanding. We were treated as an inconvenience. An apology would be nice.

Matt: Andy tried to apologise, and apologised for the confusion (not necessarily the tone).

Gemma: We get that it's stressful for them, but it is for us too. People have felt more like prisoners than people under their care.

2. Officer Reports

Elliot: Starting to plan the bike cull

Augy: Organised Matriculation photographs. Wrote short report on the marquee for Sara Watson. Ran the Halloween film showing.

Eugenie: Chasing up funding applications/risk assessments, planning c&s week (making timetable etc.). Half or more are virtual so they'll def still happen, but there is a chance that outside sports events will happen, especially before Thursday. Indoor events probs not apart from choir on Tuesday. Golf ranges etc. will be forced to close (govt already announced it). Pool was always a long-shot; now def not. Kickabout on Tuesday will be great.

Gaby: Nothing to report

Matty: Did a virtual school visit last Thursday with Imogen. Went quite well. Removes the embarrassment of asking questions because they're pre-submitted. Matt tried to look into if we can host children for free school meals, but there aren't any eligible schools nearby. We can hopefully send money/chef-power to LMH if they want to do it. Meeting with Katherine next week about interviews. It will all be online. We need to do our best to make it an ok experience for interviewees.

Sampada: did a jcr tea - pretty much is all

Grace: Began budgeting for the quarantine bags. There will be a google form when they can select stuff. We'll recommend that people go for long-term entertainments. Encouraging people to reach out to support if they need it. Florence: it's a lot of money to spend on people who don't need the subsidising. 5. Ratifications from Previous Meetings

BME Welfare Officer

This JCR notes:

- BME students at Corpus, and in the wider university, face specific challenges that non-BME students do not

- such students may feel that it is easier to talk to people with similar experiences about such issues
- issues that relate to one's race can have a negative impact on wellbeing
- with the current three welfare roles, there may not be anyone who is BME in a welfare role, discouraging BME students from talking about the aforementioned issues with any welfare reps
- other colleges, like St Anne's, have created a BME welfare rep role to better support their BME students
- just as some students might feel more comfortable talking to a (specifically) male or female welfare officer, the same may be true for a BME welfare officer
- many colleges (such as Trinity) have five or six welfare officers, as opposed to Corpus's three

This JCR believes:

- it is important that the welfare reps in general reflect the student population at Corpus
- the existence of this BME Welfare Rep role should not serve to preserve the whiteness of other welfare roles, but rather to ensure better representation
- not all people who fall under 'BME' face the same issues at Corpus, but that this role would make it easier to talk to someone with potentially similar experiences or a shared understanding of what it is like to be BME at Oxford

This JCR resolves to:

- Create a new role of "BME Welfare Officer" with the same Standing Orders as the Gender-Neutral Welfare Officer, but specifying that this officer must be BME
- Mandate the Returning Officer to make any necessary adjustments to the Standing Orders and Constitution

Cutlery Chaos
